

#### Working with Children Check

The Department of Education has strict policy around the Working with Children Check. The WWC Check is a minimum checking standard set by the Working with Children Act 2005 for those who work with children. either on a paid or voluntary basis.

To be a volunteer at a school a Working with Children Card provided by the Department of Justice is required. This card is:

- valid for 5 years
- transferable between volunteer organisations
- free of charge for volunteers, but cannot be used for paid employment.

Though it is not strictly necessary for parents to provide a Working with Children Card if they are volunteering to work with their own child, our school is asking for volunteers to obtain one to prevent any future difficulties. Please follow the link to apply for a Working with Children Card. www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au . Please note that Teachers with a current VIT registration card and Victorian Police Officers are exempt from Working with Children Checks.


