


#### **Principal's Report**

#### **Parent Complaint Process**

I would like to remind parents/carers of the most effective process if you have a complaint in regard to anything that has happened at school. The following text from the DEECD document located at <a href="http://www.education.vic.gov.au/Documents/school/parents/primary/">http://www.education.vic.gov.au/Documents/school/parents/primary/</a> parentcomplaints.pdf

The school should always be your first point of contact. Schools need to know if you have any concerns about your child's education. Teaching and learning works best when parents and teachers talk to each other and work together to solve any problems. Any appointments to speak with school staff about a complaint should be arranged through the school office. Plan what you will say so you can clearly explain what the problem is. (You might want to make some notes to help you. Have some ideas about how the problem could be resolved realistically.

Talk about the problem with your child's teacher/s by telephone or organise a face-to-face meeting. Most problems can be solved this way. If you still have a concern after talking to your child's teacher/s you may want to speak to the Assistant Principal or Principal.

#### **Urgent Notice for Parents: Student Absences**

If your child is absent from school, it is vital that you communicate this to the school. This can be via email, phone call or written in your child's communication book. If your child travels in one of our school buses, you must <u>also</u> ring the bus supervisor and inform them of any absence or change to the bus arrangements. This is vital as we need to account for every student in the school at all times.

#### **Assistant Principals' Report**

This term we celebrated National
Literacy and Numeracy week at Concord
School and we had a wonderful week
showing off all of our wonderful
academic skills. Across the school
students participated in the 'Read for
Australia' activity by reading and
exploring Aaron Blabey's Sunday
Chutney. This story explores issues of



difference, resilience and change and every student from the Junior Section to the Secondary Section was able to understand the text from their own unique perspective.

Students also worked through various numeracy activities with a particular focus on water to increase their understanding of sustainability giving the numeracy skills real world, hands on connections and making them relevant to the student. **Literacy and Numeracy** week gave us a chance to work across Sections with the Junior and Middle Sections of the school combining for a dress up day and Transition students mentoring other students throughout the school

Like many of our celebrations this term the **Literacy and Numeracy** week gave our students the opportunity to practice and display core and fundamental skills within their regular learning program. While we have been busy learning the Victorian Government are on the verge of making some legislative change that will impact schools. The Victorian Parliament is considering new laws that would change the penalties for young people involved in sexting.

Sexting refers to sending sexually explicit photos or videos electronically. This is typically done via text message, social networks, email, and mobile apps such as Snapchat. It has become increasingly common among teenagers and is an issue at secondary schools throughout Australia.

Under the new laws, young people will no longer be found guilty of child pornography charges or placed on the Sex Offenders Register if they send or receive consensual, non-exploitative sexts. Images that capture a criminal act, however, such as a sexual assault, will not fall under the new laws.

Though the penalties for consensual sexting may be reduced, it's important that young people are educated to understand associated risks to their wellbeing. Once a 'sext' has been sent, there's no going back, and what may have been consensual at the time is often a cause for regret later.

DEECD's Bully Stoppers page provides information and tips to help students and parents deal with sexting and other online issues such as cybersafety and cyberbullying.

We have enjoyed our term of learning and look forward to the exciting prospects that the fourth term will bring us.
