


#### **Principal's Report**

The following changes have been made.

- The campuses have been re-named Watsonia Campus and Bundoora Campus.
- The Year Prep-6 classes will now be in the Primary School and the Year 7-12 classes will in the Secondary School. Year 11-12 will also be known as Senior Secondary.
- The Primary School will incorporate the learning areas of Lower Primary and Upper Primary. The Secondary School will incorporate the learning areas of Secondary 7-8, Secondary 9-10 and Secondary 11-12 (Senior Secondary).

The reasons for these changes are that this terminology

- is simpler and provides an accurate description of where the campuses are and the age of the students within each learning area.
- makes it easier for current parents and students when discussing their schooling with others familiar with mainstream terminology.

For example, a student in Pathways can say that they are in Year 9 as opposed to saying they are in Pathways and then having to explain they are in a Special School and what that means. Prospective parents and students are also more easily able to identify with enrolment in our school.

This terminology emphasises that we are one P-12 school working together for all students. We now teach through the mainstream AusVELS and VCAL curriculums and use consistent assessment tools to collect data and track student progress. Our curriculum programs are now carefully planned to consider the 'learning journey' of students from Prep-12 with 'learning areas' differentiating though offering content and teaching strategies that are both age and developmentally appropriate.

In case you were wondering, year levels cannot be used within the Primary School as has been done in the Secondary School as each year the number of students who move from the Lower Primary to the Upper Primary across the Year 3-4 levels varies based on the number of available classrooms at the Bundoora Campus. Therefore, there is not a fixed year level at which a student moves from one Campus to another.

#### **Junior Section Production – Movie Magic**

Last Friday night, Kirrily, Colin and I (with my 8 year old son Bailey) had the privilege of attending the Junior Production of 'Movie Magic'. The student performances, costuming and lighting made it an incredibly entertaining evening. What struck me was the enthusiasm and joy our students had in performing in front of their friends and family. Each student participated in five separate performances which is quite an achievement. Well done to Rebecca Campbell and the entire Junior team for their organisation and support of this event.

### A MESSAGE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE



#### SUNSMART REMINDER

Over exposure to the sun presents a serious health risk. Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world. It is estimated that more than 75% of skin cancers could be prevented by practising sun protection in early childhood and in adolescence. Students must be educated as to the need for suitable sun protection and must be protected from over exposure to the sun whilst at school.

The Concord School Sun Smart Policy states:

- Junior and Middle Section students are to wear hats whenever they are outside from October-April (terms 1 and 4) as this is when UV Index levels reach 3 and above. Junior and Middle Section students without hats will be restricted to playing in designated shaded areas.
- Secondary, Pathways and Transition students are strongly encouraged to wear hats whenever they are outside from October-April (terms 1 and 4) as this is when UV Index levels reach 3 and above. Secondary, Pathways and Transition students without hats will be encouraged to remain in shaded areas.
- Students will be actively encouraged to wear a broad-spectrum water resistant sunscreen (SPF30+). Parents/carers are encouraged to apply the sunscreen at home. Sunscreen can only be applied at school by students, under the supervision of a teacher, according to the manufacturer's directions.

The school uniform shop will have broad-brimmed hats and sun-protective clothing, such as long sleeve polo shirts, available for sale.

PLEASE ENSURE, DURING TERMS 1 AND 4, YOUR CHILD HAS:

- THEIR SUN HAT AVAILABLE AT SCHOOL AT ALL TIMES
- HAS SUNSCREEN APPLIED PRIOR TO ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL
- THEIR OWN SUNSCREEN SENT TO SCHOOL FOR RE-APPLICATION ON DAYS THAT THEY ARE OUTDOORS FOR PROLONGED PERIODS.
