School Uniform

This is a reminder that it is compulsory for all students to wear the full school uniform each day and that the school uniform policy is strictly enforced. Thank you to parents/carers who have supported their children in wearing the correct school uniform.

For parents/carers of students in Years 7-12, class teachers will be informing you as to which days the sports uniform is to be worn. Please note the following policy in regard to the wearing of the school jumper.

Sport Uniform

• the red woollen jumper is not to be worn with the 'sport uniform'. Only the spray jacket and/or rugby jumper are to be worn with the 'sport uniform' over the polo shirt.

Formal Uniform

• the spray jacket is not to be worn directly on top of the school shirt or dress. The red woollen jumper is the <u>first</u> item that must be worn if the student is cold. The spray jacket can then be worn over the red woollen jumper if the student is still cold.

The school also has a phone app which can be downloaded. As the school has an effective text messaging system the app is not used to send alerts, however it can be used to quickly access contact details as well as the school calendar of events. Please note, this exact address must be typed in with the www. or it will not work you will then get a login screen which will ask for the school name and password which are both 'Concord'. After this loads you will be given the option to add as an icon. Please do so and an icon of the schools' logo will load onto your phone. The first time you use it you will be asked to add it to your homescreen. Please do so as this sizes the app appropriately.



Student Behaviour

In 2014, Concord School once again has high expectations in regards to student behaviour. Our students will be given the support they require to learn and succeed to the best of their ability and there is no excuse for inappropriate behaviour. Behaviour such as bullying, swearing, disobedience and property damage is



completely unacceptable at school as well as in our society.

Parents/carers will be contacted and a conference convened if the student continues to breach school rules. The school places a high priority on making sure all students and staff work together in an environment that supports, encourages and stimulates learning and social development.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is scheduled on 13th -15th May for all students across Australia in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students with intellectual disabilities can be exempted from one or all of the NAPLAN tests and students at Concord School generally do not perform this assessment.



Please contact me before Friday, 21st February, if you do wish for your child to sit for this assessment.



Education Maintenance Allowance - information for parents currently receiving EMA

Changes to the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) for 2014:

The EMA continues to help families on lower incomes with financial assistance to cover the cost of educational expenses including textbooks, stationery, uniforms and excursions for their child up until the age of 16.

From 2014, the Victorian Government is restructuring the EMA to better target financial support to families on lower incomes. Payments made direct to parents will be increased for eligible recipients at all year levels up to age 16, with an additional ncrease for parents with students in Years Prep and 7 in recognition of the additional costs at these transition points.

In 2014 the annual EMA payment for families with children in primary school (years 1-6) will receive a payment of \$150. Families with children in secondary school (Year 8 up until the age of 16) will receive an annual payment of \$250.

The School Start Bonus which was previously received by EMA families has been discontinued as a separate payment from 2014. However, additional funding has been incorporated into the EMA meaning that parents of children in Prep and Year 7 will receive boosted EMA payments of \$200 and \$300 respectively in those years.

From 2014, the EMA will no longer be paid 50/50 between the parent and the school. The 50% school portion of the EMA will no onger be paid to schools on behalf of parents. However, \$62 million over four years will be redirected to the State's most needy schools to assist families on lower incomes. These funds will form part of the school Student Resource Packages to be allocated at the local level.

New EMA payment option

On the EMA application form you can choose to have your EMA payment;

Paid by direct deposit (Electronic Funds Transfer) into your nominated bank account or

Paid by cheque which will be posted to the school for collection or

Paid to the school to be held as credit which you can use towards education expenses

The introduction of the new payment option to have the EMA payment directed to the school provides parents with extra flexibility to assist with budgeting towards education expenses.

Eligibility:

To be eligible for the EMA in 2014, you must:

be either a parent or guardian of a primary or secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; and

be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004* or be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner or be a temporary foster parent.

* i.e — the parent/guardian must be the holder of a valid Health Care Card or valid Pension Card.

The eligibility criteria must be met as at **28th January 2014** (Instalment One) and **14th July 2014** (Instalment Two).

Payment Amounts - 2014:

Student year level (or age for ungraded and special school students) will determine the amount payable. Parents of students turning 16 years in 2014 are paid on a pro rata basis.

Contact: School Office for an EMA application form and to lodge your application. The closing date for EMA application forms to be submitted to the school is 28th February 2014.

Foster Parents must provide a letter from The Department of Human Services stating they have temporary caregivers.
