Autism Accreditation

Concord School became the first school to have achieved full accreditation through AMAZE (formerly Autism Victoria) late in 2013. This was a rigorous process through which our school had to demonstrate that we met a series of standards relating to providing processes, resources and programs to best meet the need of students on the autism spectrum. This was done not only through us providing documentation but AMAZE also conducted a series of site visits. While our school is not specifically for students on the Autism Spectrum, strategies such as providing structure and communication cues are beneficial to all students.

Every Day Counts - School Attendance

We all want our students to get a great education and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes. Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, please speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.

From 1st March 2014, new laws will mean that parents can be fined for not sending students to school without an acceptable reason. If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

Student Accident Insurance Arrangements

Parents are reminded that the DEECD does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. Student accident insurance policies are available from some commercial insurers. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare or private health insurance.

Student Internet and E-mail

At Concord School, as part of the technology program, students access the internet and many use email as part of their educational program. Concord School believes that it is important that your child has access to and learns how to use the internet safely and appropriately.

As a part of this program, students will be educated in safety and ethical issues in dealing with the internet. It is also important that families are involved in discussions about these issues with their children. Some of these issues include: inappropriate web sites, email and chat conduct, exchanging personal details and plagiarism/ copyright. When using the internet, there are dangers and it is possible for students to access inappropriate information. Concord School has taken every reasonable measure to protect students from accessing unsuitable sites. The students are only permitted to access specific sites nominated by their teacher and under supervision.




School Representative Council (SRC)

STUDENTS BUS TRAVEL

We are indeed fortunate to now have eight buses provided by the DEECD for our students to travel upon to and from Concord School. The majority of our students who catch these buses are very well behaved and always demonstrate the school value of respect. From time to time however, some students make poor choices when travelling on the buses. It is an expectation that students travelling on the buses will:

- · Speak quietly
- · Remain in their seat
- · Get along with others

The bus supervisors do a tremendous job each day ensuring student safety on the bus journey. When a bus supervisor speaks to a student or parent/carer about unacceptable behaviour, they also report this behaviour to the school. Initially students may be given a warning, but if their behaviour does not improve they may be removed from the bus for a short time as a consequence. Students who are engaging in behaviour which may jeopardise their safety or the safety of the other students may be removed from the bus immediately.

We also expect that our students who travel independently on the public bus system demonstrate exemplary behaviour and the school value of respect. This is particularly important as these students are representing Concord School in the wider community.

We appreciate parent/carer support and cooperation in this matter as we need to ensure all students have an enjoyable and safe journey to and from school each day.



Education Maintenance Allowance - information for parents currently receiving EMA

Changes to the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) for 2014:

The EMA continues to help families on lower incomes with financial assistance to cover the cost of educational expenses including textbooks, stationery, uniforms and excursions for their child up until the age of 16.

From 2014, the Victorian Government is restructuring the EMA to better target financial support to families on lower incomes. Payments made direct to parents will be increased for eligible recipients at all year levels up to age 16, with an additional ncrease for parents with students in Years Prep and 7 in recognition of the additional costs at these transition points.

In 2014 the annual EMA payment for families with children in primary school (years 1-6) will receive a payment of \$150. Families with children in secondary school (Year 8 up until the age of 16) will receive an annual payment of \$250.

The School Start Bonus which was previously received by EMA families has been discontinued as a separate payment from 2014. However, additional funding has been incorporated into the EMA meaning that parents of children in Prep and Year 7 will receive boosted EMA payments of \$200 and \$300 respectively in those years.

From 2014, the EMA will no longer be paid 50/50 between the parent and the school. The 50% school portion of the EMA will no onger be paid to schools on behalf of parents. However, \$62 million over four years will be redirected to the State's most needy schools to assist families on lower incomes. These funds will form part of the school Student Resource Packages to be allocated at the local level.

New EMA payment option

On the EMA application form you can choose to have your EMA payment;

Paid by direct deposit (Electronic Funds Transfer) into your nominated bank account or

Paid by cheque which will be posted to the school for collection or

Paid to the school to be held as credit which you can use towards education expenses

The introduction of the new payment option to have the EMA payment directed to the school provides parents with extra flexibility to assist with budgeting towards education expenses.

Eligibility:

To be eligible for the EMA in 2014, you must:

be either a parent or guardian of a primary or secondary school student up to the age of sixteen; and

be an eligible beneficiary of a Centrelink pension, allowance or benefit within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004* or be a Veterans Affairs (TPI) pensioner or be a temporary foster parent.

* i.e — the parent/guardian must be the holder of a valid Health Care Card or valid Pension Card.

The eligibility criteria must be met as at **28th January 2014** (Instalment One) and **14th July 2014** (Instalment Two).

Payment Amounts - 2014:

Student year level (or age for ungraded and special school students) will determine the amount payable. Parents of students turning 16 years in 2014 are paid on a pro rata basis.

Contact: School Office for an EMA application form and to lodge your application. The closing date for EMA application forms to be submitted to the school is 28th February 2014.

Foster Parents must provide a letter from The Department of Human Services stating they have temporary caregivers.
